## Peace United Church of Christ Scholarship Fund

The purpose of the Scholarship Fund is to give financial aid and recognition to members of this Church who have shown significant academic and other constructive accomplishment in their school career and church participation.

All members of the Church who, in the opinion of the Committee are qualified and worthy recipients based upon the following criteria are eligible to receive a scholarship:

- Academic achievement
- Service to the Church
- Christian character
- Educational aims

Members may re-apply annually. Applicants may request aid toward the education of their choice beyond High School.

Application forms are available in the Church office or on our website. Applications must be received by **June 1**.

Notification of scholarship awards will be made by July 1. Amounts will vary annually. Applicants selected to receive a scholarship shall be expected to remain in continuous attendance in school for the entire semester. Applicants must submit a transcript of their grades ASAP before February 1, 2023, following the completion of the first semester, in order to receive their scholarship. Applicants must have successfully completed 12 credits, (full-time student) with no less than a 2.0 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale).

**6:30** Call to Order (Kathy) Timekeeper: Mark Bocher

Mark presented an opening prayer.

Approval of Agenda (a) Motion: Karen Kletti, Second: Clark Pearson. Motion approved.

Approval of Minutes from prior month Motion: Karen Kletti, Second: Marnie Winninghoff, Minutes approved.

**6:40** Scholarship committee presentation (Kay Blackburn) Vote taken to approve the motion out of committee to update the Scholarship policy. 13 yes, 1 abstain, and 1 no, motion thus approved.

17 applicants approved by the committee receive scholarships if criteria is met. Out of the 17, 2 people did not submit transcripts, and 1did not meet the requirements. Motion out of committee to issue 14 checks of \$750, with 2 getting an extra \$750 (due to obtaining 100% of volunteer log) and 1 getting an extra \$350 (due to obtaining 60% of volunteer log). Vote taken and all approved the issuing of the checks.

Kay requested that anyone requesting a potential policy change should submit future ideas that can then be further reviewed by the committee. Special thanks to Kay and the committee for all the good work put into this mission.

**6:50 Financial report** (Cathy Stern) Motion by Clark Pearson to place the financial report on file for audit, with a 2nd coming from Paul Behring. Motion approved.

- Kitchen (Karen)- Contracts signed and checks have been cut. Kitchen stove sold for \$100. Working on getting rid of the cabinets and refrigerators. Another quote received for a hood, saving \$16,000. Those monies will be put towards better cabinets. Once appliances and hood are here, then the construction will start. No committed timing on the start date at this time.
- coffee hour (Kathy) We now have coffee hour team leaders! They will be working on a plan to engage the congregation and for now will be providing food and set up/clean up.
- Cemetery (Paul) Wally Mueller provided a proposal to update the Cemetery sign. Would be black marble with white/silver writing at a starting cost of \$8,285. Also reviewed a mausoleum concept as well as updating the driveway. Conversations will continue on this aspect.
- Special Offering (Marnie) -Motion from committee to split Lenten offerings equally between: Kewaskum community food pantry shared with Full Shelf West Bend, Albrecht Clinic, UCC disaster relief, Malawi (Africa) Aiding single mothers. Motion approved.
- Associate Pastor update (Becky) search committee is being formed

   members may no longer be serving. Committee will meet in March. Approval has been given to send the
   invite to pastors who are from our church (Gretchen Van Ess, Eric Ogi) Conversation has been had
