From the Pastor's Study

There is an origin story for our congregation which always humbles me. On June 2nd, 1898, a group of nine men gathered and began planning for the establishment of what would become Peace Church. I've heard over the years that they may have broken away from the Lutheran church in town because that church frowned on the farmers stopping for a beer after their trek into church on Sundays. And I've heard that they were motivated by a desire to start an Evangelical Church in the area. Whatever the reason, those nine families dreamed a vision way beyond themselves. On August 20th that same year (124 years ago) they laid the original cornerstone for our church building. By November 4th a few months later they were dedicating the church and worshipping in their new church building. That timeline stuns, and humbles, me every time that I read it. Of course, I'm also stunned when I hear that they built the whole enterprise for \$3,900 thanks to lots of the work being done by the members.

There are parts of the story that, like most histories of the period, lack much mention of the contributions of all the strong women who I'm certain were at least as responsible for the success. I often think of that verse from 2nd Timothy: "I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you." We are often reminded that behind every dream there are so many people who are faithfully working to bring it to fruition. We are given the remarkable opportunity to look back through the last 124 years and see and name so many faithful stewards of the life of our congregation. We have come a long, long way as a witness to the extravagant love of God in our world.

These days we continue in an interesting moment within the life of the Church. We are still emerging from a period of significant disruption that was thrust upon us by both the pandemic and a moment in our nation's history which has pulled at the fabric of our unity. The story is still unfolding, the conclusion yet unwritten. But there is a vision and a witness which is rooted in our past that we would do well to remember. Great things are possible when we share a vision and a dream. We have named a vision, that we "exist to feed souls, grow in God's extravagant love, and together serve all of God's children and creation." We've articulated a mission that we are to "Love like Jesus... welcoming all, loving all, growing in faith together, and seeking justice for all." The dream is vast and deep, and not unfamiliar. As we think about how we navigate reclaiming our momentum forward I hope that we can all put our shoulder to the dream that God is inviting us into as a community. It will take all of us, and it will take reclaiming the faithfulness of the generations before us and those yet to come.

In concrete ways, we are busy revamping Sunday School to try to make it more engaging for the students, and also to have it deepen their understanding of our sacred story and their faith. In this Tidings you will find a description of the rotation model that we will be implementing this fall. It should be fun, and it should offer new opportunities for members of the congregation to share the faith formation of the next generation. Confirmation is also shifting to include all our middle school students, 6th-8th in the Sunday morning confirmation curriculum. We will continue working to energize our Middle School youth group and seek to rekindle energy among our High School youth. We are hoping that we can also renew our energy and commitment to our missions with Habitat for Humanity after a time without mission trips. We are already planning a trip for the beginning of the New Year for our college-aged/young adult group. And we're excited as we dream how our soon-to-be-finished kitchen might become a hub for a host of mission and ministry opportunities. There is yet more inspiration to break forth from among us. It will take all of us. What a year to consider how we reclaim our mission and vision as we work toward 125 years of Peace Church proclaiming God's love in the world. Blessings,

Meeting called to order at 6:34pm, and began with an opening prayer from Pastor.

Approval of Agenda (a) Motion Clark Pearson: Second: Vance Reif. Motion approved.

Approval of July minutes: Motion made by Karen Kletti with a second by Lisa Atwater. Motion approved.

Financial report was presented by Tom Kolb. Giving fell short again this past month by \$9,000, now giving us a general fund deficit of \$47,000.

Motion to place the financial report on file for audit by Ken Singer with a second by Clark Pearson. Motion approved.

- Building use safe sanctuary & fees policy presented by Clark Pearson. Motion made out of committee to approve the policy. Motion approved.
- Cemetery project has been moving along nicely. More of an update coming next month.
- Kitchen update provided by Karen Kletti. Cabinets in the hallway are being installed.
- Picnic update provided by Becky Manthei. Thanks to Texas Roadhouse for donating the buns and our generous congregation underwriting items and donating prizes and time.

Children's Ministry at Peace Church

Become a dreamer! Please join us in dreaming what we believe is God's dream for Children's Ministry at Peace Church. It's a dream of children who cannot wait for Sunday morning to arrive because Sunday morning is the highlight of their week. It's a dream where kids embrace Jesus because his story is written on their hearts. It's a dream where adults are excited to be part of Children's' Ministry because they love God and children and are committed to the future of Christ's church. It's a dream where parents and congregation members work in concert to share the amazing story of the Christian faith in a way that finds children falling hopelessly in love with Jesus.

Chasing this dream means doing Sunday School in a different way. The new model for ministry is called the Workshop Rotation Model. Ministry within the framework of the model promises to be filled with fun surprises for the kids, encouraging them to engage the Good News in unique ways. The new ministry is dubbed "Jam! Jesus and Me".

Here's how the model works:

Kids will be divided into two broadly graded groups: K4-2nd Grade; 3rd Grade-5th Grade. 6th-8th Grade will gather in the Youth Room each week for their pre-confirmation focus on the Old and New Testaments and Foundations of Faith.

During the course of the year, children K4-5th Grade will focus on seven key scripture lessons:

The Great Commandment
Advent/Christmas: Magi
The Prodigal Son
The 10 Commandments
The Good Samaritan
The Last Supper

Psalm 23

The students will dive deep into the stories, visiting a workshop each week, and discovering Gospel truths through the use of drama, videos, games, arts, drama, cooking or science. By each unit's end, each class will explore the Bible lesson from four or five different vantage points.

Why the new model?

- It's fun! Each week holds new surprises for the kids. They can wonder what crazy dish they'll concoct to help them learn an important lesson of faith. They can anticipate moving around as they play games designed to help them remember the Gospel, they can let their imagination soar as they pretend they're a Bible character or they can visually express their interpretation of a scripture lesson through the creation of artwork.
- It helps kids remember foundational lessons of faith. Kids learn through repetition, remembering as main concepts and ideas are regularly repeated. The model helps kids recall God's word.

- It takes into account kids' learning styles. Some kids learn best if they have the chance to read, while others learn best if they can move. For some children, interaction with others paves the way for their learning. This educational model allows us to cover more learning-style bases, and will give our kids the chance to really grasp the depth and breadth of God's love.
- It's volunteer friendly. The workshop rotation model allows leadership participation based on the interests and giftedness of the adults of the congregation. So, someone who loves cooking can lead or assist with that lesson. Budding artists can help the students sculpt, draw or paint their way to expressing a Bible truth they've discovered in class. Because all the children will learn essentially the same lesson, he/she will only need to prepare one lesson plan for the two weeks during which the two groups attend the workshop.

If someone can't get enough of hanging out with the kids, then they might jump at the chance to be a shepherd—a person who attends and participates in lessons with them and talks with them about the story and how it impacts their lives. Others who enjoy administrative tasks can engage in ministry on a more flexible and behind-the-scenes basis.
